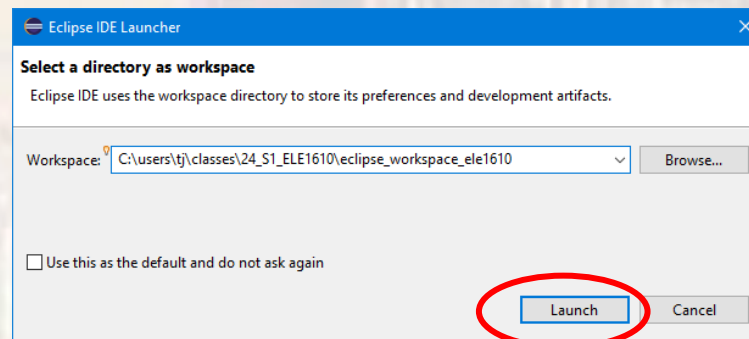

Eclipse Project Setup

- Eclipse Project
 - An Eclipse project is a directory with all the necessary configuration files to create a working program
 - Configuration files
 - Includes
 - Debug
 - Your code and header files
 - Can have more than one code solution in a project
 - Includes a mechanism to exclude some files
 - You don't have to remove/delete alternate solutions
 - Eclipse searches the current project for
 - Settings
 - Any `.c` files
 - Any `.h` files
 - A **SINGLE** `main()` function

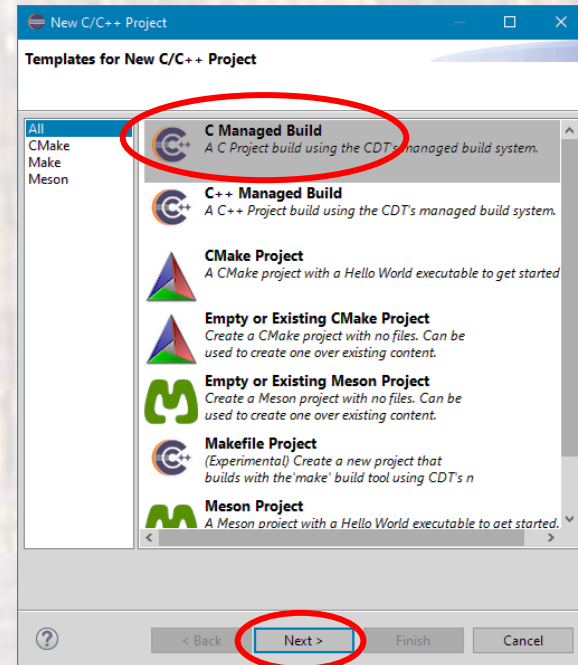
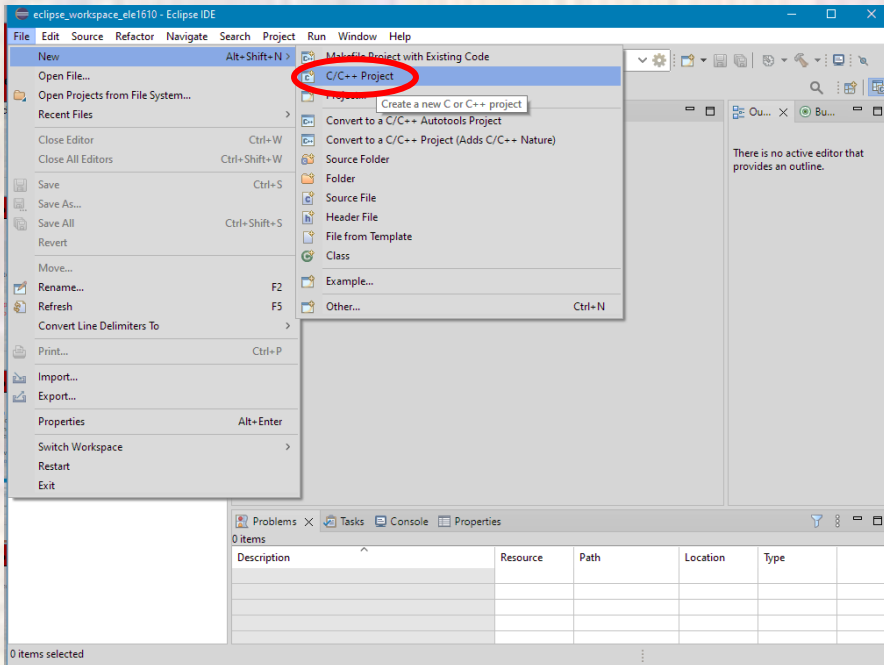
Eclipse Project Setup

- Open Eclipse
 - Double-click the Desktop Icon (if created)
 - Select the Start Menu icon (if created)
 - Go to C:\Users\your-user-name\eclipse\cpp-2022-06\eclipse and select eclipse.exe
- It should default to your last workspace
 - if not, Browse to the workspace folder for this class
- Select Launch



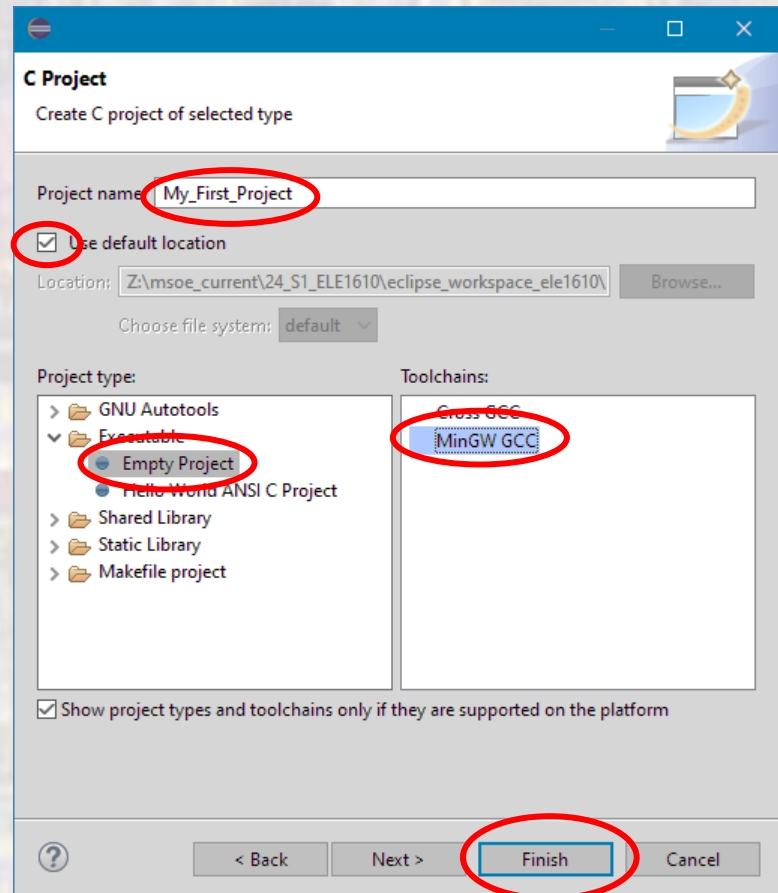
Eclipse Project Setup

- Create Project
 - Close the **Welcome** tab (if open)
 - **Select File** → **New** → **C/C++ Project**
 - **Select C Managed Build**
 - **Next**



Eclipse Project Setup

- Create Project
 - Provide a meaningful Project name
 - Use Capitals to differentiate from code files
 - E.G.
 - HW3_Project
 - Space_Ship_Project
 - Check Use default location
 - Should be your workspace
 - Select Empty Project
 - Select MinGW GCC
 - Select Finish



Eclipse Project Setup

- Create Project
 - **Expand** The project name (down carrot)
