# Running in a Terminal Window

- There are times we want to run our program outside of eclipse
  - The console does not allow cursor positioning – everything is printed in sequence
- To run our program outside of Eclipse
  - After compilation – in Windows go to the [project\\_directory](#)
  - Go into the debug folder
  - Double click on the file: [project\\_name.exe](#)
  - A Windows terminal will open
  - Place your cursor in the window to allow keyboard input

[project\\_directory](#) and [project\\_name](#) are what you used for your project

# Running in a Terminal Window

- Modifying the Terminal Window Properties
  - These changes do not take effect until the next time you open the window
- To change the background color
  - **rt-click** in the window and select properties
  - **select** the Colors tab
  - **select** the Screen Background button
  - **select** the color from the pallet
- To stop the cursor from flashing
  - **rt-click** in the window and select properties
  - **select** the Terminal tab
  - **set** the cursor color to match the background color

# Running in a Terminal Window

- Modifying the Terminal Window Properties
  - These changes take effect immediately and the next time you open the window
- To change the window size
  - **rt-click** in the window and select properties
  - **select** the Layout tab
  - **set** the Window Size – Width and Height
